Leave No Trace Trainer

Wilderness First Aid

A Wilderness First Aid course will be held May 1-2 at the American Red Cross in Oklahoma City located on 601 NE 6th St from 8:30-4:30pm each day. The cost is \$35, which includes all classroom materials. The class is limited to 20 participants and they must be at least 14 years old. Be sure to wear comfortable clothes, and bring raingear, water bottle, and backpack with gear that you would use on a wilderness activity, and lunch.
